Single Market Programme - Food

SMP Food supports human, animal and plant health by providing access to safe and high-quality food in the integrated European Single Market

SMP Food goals



- Prevention, control and eradication of **animal and plant diseases**;
- Fight against **antimicrobial resistance**;
- Improvement of **animal welfare** across the EU.

- Prevention of **food waste** and fight against fraud;
- **Sustainable** and **resilient** production of **food**;
- Effectiveness and reliability of official **controls** along the food chain;
- Contribution to the **EU 'Farm to Fork'** targets.

(co-) Funding rates for grants

SMP Food:

- Fixed in the annual work programme for each action
- Most activities: 50% or 75% : **Greece** benefits from the higher CoFunding Rate for most of the grants under SMP Food (75% instead of 50%)
- Some priorities actions (e.g. activities in Third Countries or for the EURLs): up to 100%

* Indirect costs included as a flat rate of 7% of the direct eligible costs



Better Training for Safer Food (BTFSF)

The BTFSF initiative develops an EU training strategy in the areas of food law, feed law, animal health, animal welfare rules and plant health rules

SMP Food actions for 2024

- Grants to improve the measurement of **food waste** and help implement food waste prevention
 - For **EU countries**

- Coordinated Control Plan for **Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR)** monitoring in commensal and zoonotic agents on samples of food and food-producing animals
- **Veterinary programmes** to support prevention, control and eradication of animal diseases;

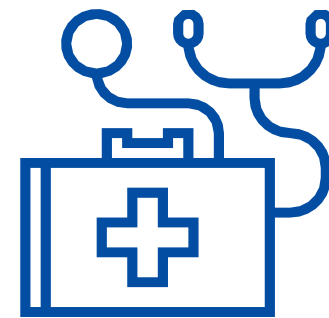

EU4Health:

- Action and operating grants: up to 60% of eligible costs are co-financed, unless specified otherwise in the specific calls for proposals
 - Exceptional utility: up to 80% (or even 100%) of eligible costs
- Work programme identified grants (e.g. WHO, ERNs etc.): up to 100%

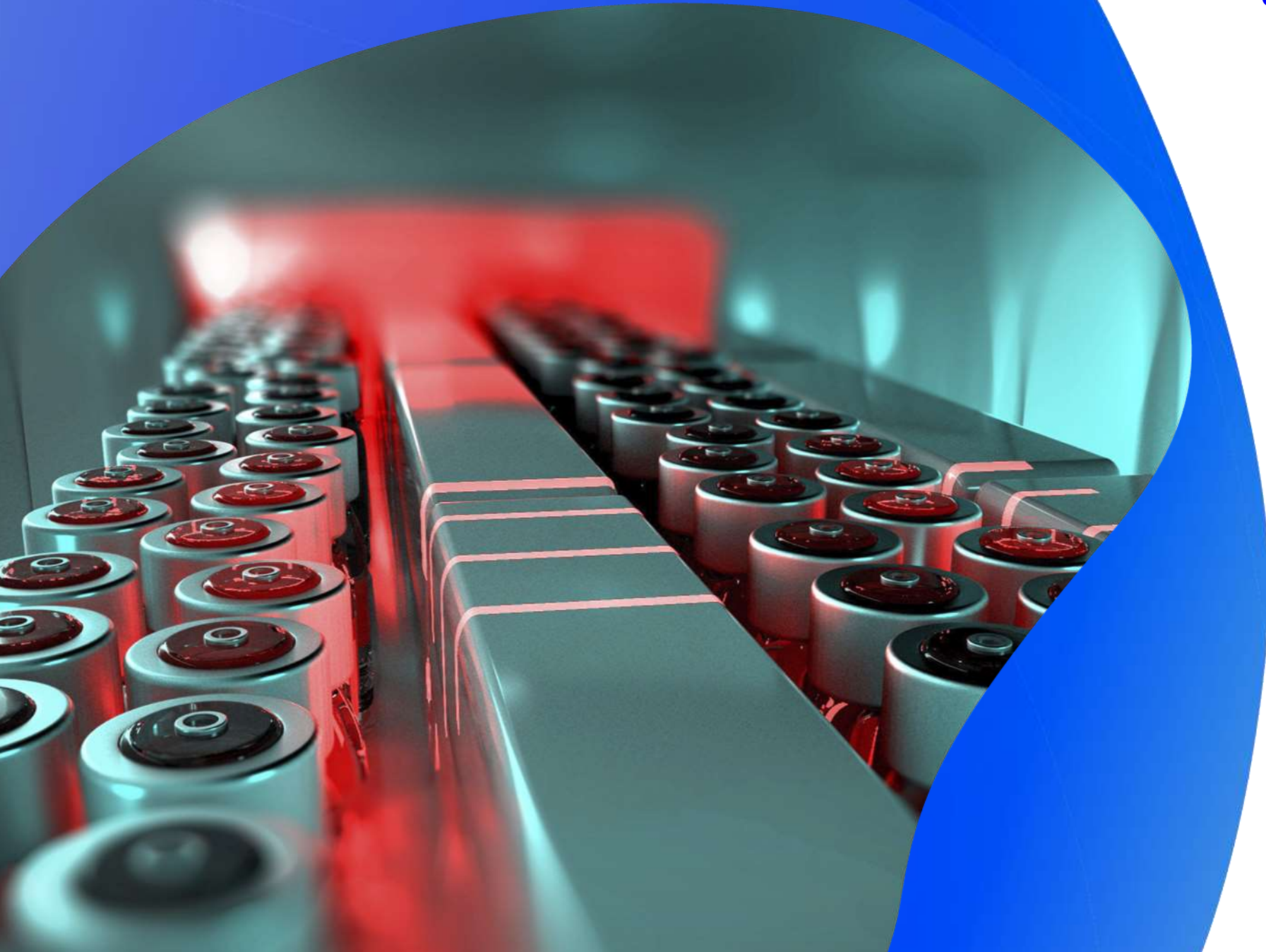

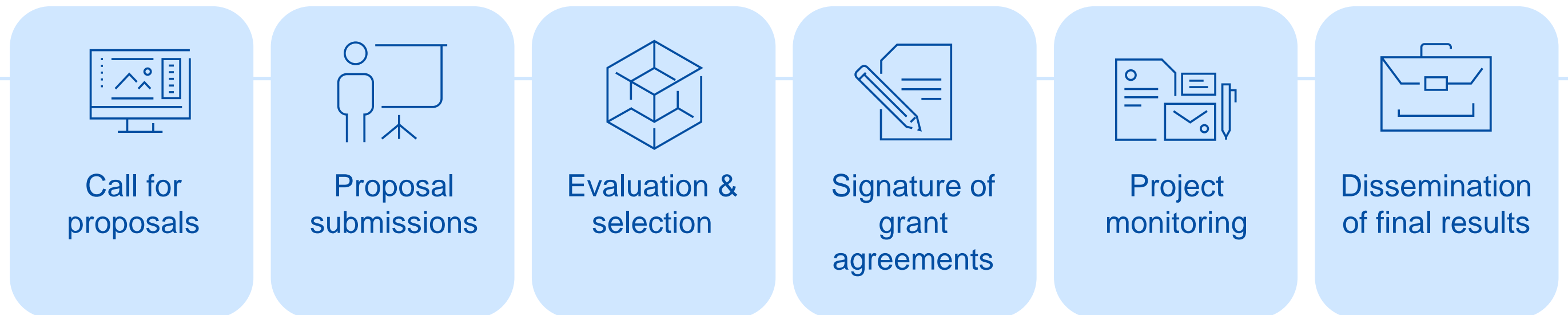

- Research and Innovation Actions* ([RIA](#)): up to 100%
- Innovation Actions* ([IA](#)): up to 70% for for-profit organisations and 100% for non-profit organisations
- Coordination and Support Actions* ([CSA](#)): up to 100%
- Pre-Commercial Procurement actions* (PCP) : up to 100%
- Public Procurement of Innovative solutions* (PPI): up to 50%

Examples of projects

Horizon 2020 (2014-20): 287 participations in projects (35 as coordinator)

- MES-CoBraD - Multidisciplinary Expert System for the Assessment & Management of Complex Brain Disorders
EU grant: €5.65m – 14 participants, led by NTUA, incl. the Neurological Institute of Athens (NIA), HOLISTIC IKE & MICHPOULOS I. & CH. G.P.
- DigiCare4You - An intersectoral innovative solution involving DIGItal tools, empowering families and integrating community CARE services for the prevention and management of type 2 diabetes and hypertension –
EU grant: €4.4 m – 17 participants, led by Harokopio University of Athens (HUA), incl. University of Athens and National Center for Research and Technological Development (EKETA), with Australia & US.

Examples of projects

Horizon Europe (2021-27): 238 participations in projects (25 as coordinator)

- NextGEM - Next Generation Integrated Sensing and Analytical System for Monitoring and Assessing Radiofrequency Electromagnetic Field Exposure and Health.

EU grant: €7.56m – 19 participants, led by FORTH, incl. Intracom Telecom.

- ONCOSCREEN - A European “shield” against colorectal cancer based on novel, more precise and affordable risk-based screening methods and viable policy pathways – EU grant: €12.97m – 40 participants, led by Exus Software, incl. CERTH, Research Academic Institute of Communication Systems & Computers, Ministry of Health (GR) and Hellenic Society of Gastrointestinal Oncology.

Funding collaborative research

– basic principles

- Annual work programmes published or updated each year.
- Funding rate for most topics: up to 100% of eligible costs + 25% for indirect costs.
- Collaborative research grants: min. 3 independent legal entities from 3 different EU Member States (min 1) or associated countries.
- Partners from 3rd countries can be included, without funding for industrialised countries.
- Single-stage OR two-stage application process.
- Peer review by panels of independent experts; 3 evaluation criteria (Excellence, Impact, Implementation).
- Ethics screening for every shortlisted proposal.
- Time to Grant : max. 8 months from submission to signing grant agreement.
- Reporting on scientific progress and on financial aspects (every 12 or 18 months).

Two-stage calls (9 topics)

EU indicative budget: **€320 million**

- Deadline 1st stage: 19 Sept. 2023
1002 proposals received => 138 proposals invited to 2nd stage
- Deadline 2nd stage: 11 April 2024

Single-stage calls (6 topics)

indicative EU budget: **€189 million**

- Deadline: 11 April 2024*
133 proposals received
- **Evaluations ongoing, results ~19 July 2024**

- **3 new topics**
- indicative EU budget: **€85 million**
- HORIZON-HLTH-2024-DISEASE-12-01: European partnership for pandemic preparedness. (COFUND - €50m)
- HORIZON-HLTH-2024-DISEASE-13-01: Implementation research for management of multiple long-term conditions in the context of non-communicable diseases (Global Alliance for Chronic Diseases - GACD). (RIA - €20m)
- HORIZON-HLTH-2024-CARE-14-01: Pre-commercial procurement for environmentally sustainable, climate neutral and circular health and care systems. (PCP - €15m)
- **Deadline: 26 Nov. 2024.**

Tips: for grants

- **Read carefully the Work Programme to identify the right funding opportunity;**
- **Pay attention to call/topic conditions, especially the eligibility conditions;**
- **Regularly check for topic updates on the Funding & Tenders portal;**
- **Be familiar with the evaluation criteria;**
- **Find partners, bringing together all necessary competences and resources;**
- **Follow the templates provided in the Submission System;**
- **Follow the dedicated info sessions, check out HaDEA website for events;**
- **Contact your National Contact/Focal Points for further clarifications;**
- **Submit as many times as you wish, but don't wait until the last minute, it's a hard deadline!**

Tips: for tenders

- **Keep an eye on the Prior Information Notices on eTED;**
- **Only tool available for questions is the Q&A section in e-Tendering; no other contacts allowed;**
- **Pay attention to tender specifications;**
- **Take note of the selection criteria, both for the technical and financial capacity;**
- **Ensure that the offer addresses the necessary competences and resources to execute the services;**
- **A template exists only for the financial offer (they should not be modified by applicants);**
- **Offers shall include all the documents/annexes requested by the tender specifications, duly signed;**
- **Value for money is important, a lower financial offer can make the difference between 2 bids of equal quality.**
- **Keep in mind that the quality of a bid is evaluated against all award criteria equally, so make sure to address all of them!**
