What is MSCA COFUND?

Mono-beneficiary action:

new or existing national, regional, institutional schemes for <u>doctoral</u> training & <u>postdoctoral</u> fellowships

Focus:

best practice, high standards & excellent working conditions, sustainable structuring effects, encouraging synergies with other EU funds



Research funding organisation



Max. EUR 10m /beneficiary /call



Duration

Programme: max. 60 months Fellowship: min. 3 months



Recruitment

Fellows: min. 3 fellows must be recruited

COFUND – Bear in mind



Researchers 100% on project

Long-term leave allowance or special needs allowance

Part-time allowed for personal or family reasons



Secondments up to 1/3 of fellowship duration



COFUND **Seal of Excellence** for applications scoring ≥85%


