Main Objectives of CraNE JA

To prepare the necessary preconditions, administrative, professional and those related to high-quality performance towards Networks of Comprehensive Cancer Centres.

To link the development of Comprehensive Cancer Care Networks (CCCNs) in EU level with CCCs established in individual Member States.

To provide an assessment on sustainability and feasibility of networking of CCCs.

25 Countries - 44 Partners Budget: 3 million EUR co-funding by EC

Expected Outcomes

- ➤ The establishment of a common and concrete understanding
- Consensus-based model for CCCs
- > The definition of clear recommendations
- ➤ The identification of current practices and patterns
- ➤ The balance between organizational aspects and quality of care of the CCCs
- ➤ A realistic and functional framework and criteria (prerequirements) to enable the implementation of CCCs within an EU Network

Critical Concepts and Issues

- 1. <u>Comprehensiveness</u> (what it is meant by the term)
- 2. Accreditation vs <u>Certification</u>
- 3. One Hospital/ Division or more co-working
- 4. Number of Types of Cancer treated (main vs all)
- 5. Research
- 6. Quality & Standards to be part of the Network

BEYOND any Certification:

Definition and Standards setting, feasible to be achieved by almost all MSs, to be developed and met in order an Oncology organization (Hospital or division) become CCC.
