Europe accounts for a tenth of the world's population, and a quarter of the world's cancer cases.

New cancer cases expected to increase more than 25% in Europe by 2035 if no actions are taken

Better and equitable prevention and diagnosis, treatment and care, survival rates and post-cancer quality of life<sup>1</sup> actions are needed



## ECHoS & NCMH - Greece

#### **Context**

According to the ECIS<sup>1</sup>, the number of people newly diagnosed with cancer will increase to more than 3,24 million by 2040.
